He was the first Aboriginal Australian to be elected to the Australian House of Representatives in 2010, and served as the Minister for Indigenous Australians between 2019 and 2022 in the Morrison government.

#### Keynote Address by reconciliation ally, Craig Foster

Following a decorated football career as Australia's 419th Socceroo and 40th Captain, Craig has become one of Australia's most respected sportspeople as a broadcaster, social justice advocate and human rights campaigner. He works across a vast range of social programs including indigenous rights and self-determination as a member of the Australian Multicultural Council.
